

A 7-STEP GUIDE TO VIEWING YOUR EVISA

Before you start, you will need:

1. Details of the ID document you used to create your UKVI account or the most recent document you have added to your account (your passport, national identity card, Biometric Residence Card (BRC) or Biometric Residence Permit (BRP))
2. Your date of birth
3. Access to the mobile phone number or email address you use to sign in to your UKVI account, as you will be sent a security code for signing in
4. Access to the internet

STEP 1


If you have received an email from the Home Office to say that your eVisa is ready to view, click the link in the email.

If you have not received an email, you can still check using this link: [View and prove your immigration status: get a share code - GOV.UK](#) .

OR, Go to Google/ your preferred web browser on your phone, laptop or other device.

Type in **'View and prove immigration status'**

You should see a link that looks like this:

STEP 2

Scroll down and click **'Start now'**



View or prove your immigration status

You'll need:

- details of the identity document you use to sign in to your UKVI account (your passport, national identity card, or biometric residence card or permit)
- your date of birth
- access to the mobile number or email address you use to sign in to your UKVI account - you'll be sent a code for signing in

STEP 3

Select the document that you used to create your UKVI account.

NOTE: If you used a BRC or BRP, and you have later added your passport to your account, you will now need to sign in with your passport.

What identity document did you use when you created your account?

If you have updated your identity document since you applied, you must use the details of the updated document to sign in.

- Passport
- National identity card
- Biometric residence card or permit

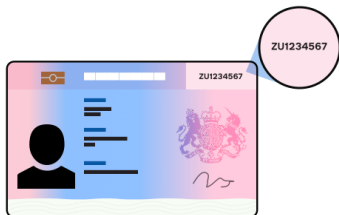

STEP 4

Enter your BRP number which is at the top right-hand corner of your card.

If you are using a passport, enter your passport number, also at the top right-hand corner of the bio page of your passport.

STEP 5

Enter your date of birth.

You should enter this as shown on your passport. For example, 31 3 1980.

STEP 6

A security code will be sent to you to help you sign in. Choose whether you would like to receive it by text message or email.

STEP 7

Check your text messages or email address for the security code. Note that you will need the most recent code that was sent as none of the previous ones will work. Also note that the code expires after 10 minutes.

Enter the security code.

If you have not received a security code, make sure the email address is correct and you have checked your spam folder.

You should now be able to see your eVisa. It will show your name, date of birth, nationality, status and when your status expires (if you do not have settlement). It will also show a photo of you and state the conditions of your leave – i.e. whether you can work, study, claim benefits etc.

It will look something like this:

If Refugee and Migrant Justice assisted you with submitting your eVisa, you can also contact us and we will submit the form for you.
